

REEL TACAMO CHOW (RTC) Cookbook history came from Steve Bug Malavolti proposed the cookbook idea in December 2009, over 11 years. Then in 2015 at the OKC VQ-3 Crew 4 family gathering John announced his commitment to the cookbooks; later in October 2021, cookbook fruition. The Reel TACAMO Chow features recipes for the 16-20 person crews, suitable for large gatherings.

"Mom" commented: If the RTC cookbook were an aircraft, it would qualify as a Hangar Queen and a Special Interest Aircraft (SPINTAC) – not flown in 60 days, 60 months, or even 120 months!

"Mom" compiled recipes from the VQ-4 Officers Wives Club, VQ-4 All Wives Club, VQ-3 Officers Wives Club, and TACAMO family recipes from Guam, Hawaii, Patuxent River, and Oklahoma to make the TACAMO Heritage Cookbook. Over 200 pages of appetizers, soups, salads, side dishes, main dishes, desserts, gravy and sauces.

Without his efforts, these cookbooks would still be tattered, torn, and scattered across the TACAMO world. The original cookbook artwork was retained to the best of TCVA's abilities with some artistic license employed.




ARLINGTON CEMETERY VISIT

Oklahoma City remembers attack on Pearl Harbor at USS Oklahoma Memorial by Zach Rael, Anchor/Reporter

On Tuesday December 7, 2021, events were held across the country to remember the attack on Pearl Harbor.

Oklahoma City remembers the attack on Pearl Harbor at the USS Oklahoma Memorial.

On Tuesday, the events were held across the country to remember the attack on Pearl Harbor. A ceremony was held at the USS Oklahoma Memorial so that Oklahoma could honor the lives lost on Dec. 7, 1941.

A lone trumpet played as members of Oklahoma's Fleet Reserve Association, along with armed forces from both past and present, gathered to honor the lives lost eight decades ago. The shocking attacks on Pearl Harbor changed the course of the nation and the world forever.

"The battle of Pearl Harbor was a defining moment in our nation's history. It really made our military into what it is today," said Captain Cedrick Jessup, Commodore, Strategic Command Wing ONE and Task Group 114.2.

The ceremony took place at the USS Oklahoma Memorial in the Veteran's War Memorial Park outside of the Capitol complex. Captain Jessup was one of the speakers who paid tribute to those killed, including the 429 sailors who died aboard the USS O k l a h o m a battleship.

"We will never forget what happened that day," Jessup said.

The attack launched the United States into World War II.

On the 80th anniversary, Captain Jessup says this day serves as a reminder of the reality of war.

"No one wants to go to war. We always want to find other ways to go to war. But if it does come to that, we want to be always ready," Jessup said.

As another year passes since the attack, Jessup said it is more important than ever to never forget.

"You have to know your history, so you don't repeat it. That is an important piece," Jessup said.

Aloha TACAMO shipmates,

I have been trying to get my hearing loss and tinnitus recognized by the VA in Hawaii for over 18 months now. They recognize that both conditions exist and also recognize that both my NEC's have a high probability for hearing loss and tinnitus. Yet, I have been denied compensation or hearing aids because I have

'not established a nexus to my service time in the Navy'. I am currently appealing the denial based on the contradictory nature of the denial.

After a few casual conversations with other TACAMO shipmates, I found that they too have hearing loss and tinnitus. Some are compensated, provided hearing aids from the VA, and others are not. This inequity seems unfair. OUR common experience around the hazardous noise of the C-130 and somewhat less of E-6 is not recognized equally.

As a Veterans Association, it is within our charter and I believe that it is our responsibility to represent our membership and advocate for the equitable distribution of recognition for what appears to be a common ailment amongst our membership.

I propose that we begin with a survey, amongst our membership to:

- Identify those of us with tinnitus and hearing loss, diagnosed or not.
- Determine who has been compensated by the VA, been provided VA hearing aids or not.
- Promote our members, who were at an elevated risk, as defined by their NEC's to file a claim with the VA and pursue the compensation we are entitled to.
- Query members who are being compensated and/or received VA
 hearing aids and learn how they were successful in their claim
 and use that as a guide for other claimants.

Thanks for your support for this sort of endeavor by the TCVA. Show your support and concerns by participating in the upcoming survey, coming soon.
